

    - Effects of allocation decisions
    - Impacts of seafood imports

## **Research & Monitoring**

Identify underserved communities and their needs, conduct collaborative research, and assess impacts of management decisions

- Longer Term (Unfunded) Actions Dependent Upon Additional Resources
  - Conduct situational analysis of marine aquaculture in the U.S. Caribbean
     -- strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, threats
  - Identify challenges and lessons learned from disaster events
  - Evaluate equity issues throughout commercial and recreational fisheries
  - Examine the importance of diversifying operations in fisheries
  - Analyze impacts of management services and decisions -- social, cultural, and economic; expected vs. actual
  - Conduct research to illuminate specific underserved populations and issues, including subsistence use and women in fishing

## **Policies & Plans**

### Immediate or Near-Term (Funded) Actions

- Aquaculture grants and research opportunities
- SE Climate Regional Action Plans
- Fisher surveys
- National Seafood Strategy (trade and market issues, Culebra Fishing Association Pilot, FAO voluntary guidelines for small-scale fisheries)
- Safe fishing zone designation for Lang Bank
- Engagement and entry barriers (procedural, limited access)
- Policy guidance on financial assistance for underserved community engagement

## **Policies & Plans**

Ensure that policies promote equal opportunities for all and do not create unintended inequities or unequal burdens for underserved communities

- Longer Term (Unfunded) Actions Dependent Upon Additional Resources
  - Simplify permit access and renewal processes and provide technical support
  - Develop policy framework to understand, gather, and incorporate local and traditional ecological knowledge



## Benefits

Distribute benefits equitably by increasing access to opportunities

- Immediate or Near-Term (Funded) Actions
  - Track and report data
  - Identify and address barriers -- grants, vocational, capital
  - Promote or improve equitability of fishery disaster assistance allocations
  - Preserve infrastructure, working waterfronts
  - Promote monitoring and mitigation of major infrastructure impacts, natural resource injuries
  - Minimize user conflicts with wind energy projects

## **Benefits**

### Distribute benefits equitably by increasing access to opportunities



- Longer Term (Unfunded) Actions Dependent Upon Additional Resources
  - Advance and improve science and management in the U.S. Caribbean
  - Co-develop or support high school technical courses and vocational training in fishing and aquaculture

## **Outreach & Engagement**

Build relationships with underserved communities to better understand engagement preferences and improve information sharing

- Longer Term (Unfunded) Actions Dependent Upon Additional Resources
  - Integrate additional translation funding into annual budget and planning processes
  - Identify or create multilingual stakeholder liaison(s) at SERO and the SEFSC
  - Establish community liaison network of NOAA Sea Grant and other partners as appropriate
  - Employ strategies to facilitate more frequent and meaningful outreach and interaction with female stakeholders

## Inclusive Governance

- Immediate or Near-Term (Funded) Actions
  - Engagement strategies for public meetings and input processes; Council and other advisory bodies
  - Information sharing about Council appointment opportunities, process
  - Considered use of Council Committees/Advisory Panels to advise on EEJ issues, support implementation plan
  - Educational materials and training programs
  - Options to inform research priorities, contribute to or participate in research
  - Early engagement in Endangered Species Act decision making

## Inclusive Governance

Enable the meaningful involvement of underserved communities in decision-making

- Longer Term (Unfunded) Actions Dependent Upon Additional Resources
  - Leverage community liaisons to gather and report rural and other underserved community input
  - Develop targeted competitive grants and pilot projects





Empowering Environment Provide institutional support to implement EEJ

- Immediate or Near-Term (Funded) Actions
  - Integration of EEJ commitments into organizational priorities
  - EEJ funding strategy
  - EEJ implementation teams -- NMFS and Councils
  - EEJ training -- NMFS and Councils
  - Partnerships to diversify STEM pipeline
  - Scholarship, internship, mentorship programs
  - Partnerships to leverage resources and address cross-jurisdictional challenges

### **Empowering Environment** *Provide institutional support to implement EEJ*

 Longer Term (Unfunded) Actions Dependent Upon Additional Resources
 Organizational capacity --



- Organizational capacity -- EEJ Coordinators, full-time anthropologists or other non-economic social scientists, full-time biologists for Caribbean work
- Training -- Plain language, facilitation, unconscious bias
- Technical assistance with grants and other funding opportunities
