

Marine Recreational Information Program (MRIP) Updates

169th Caribbean Fishery Management Council Meeting
June 23-24, 2020

Overview

Through MRIP, NOAA Fisheries and its state, regional, and federal partners use in-person, telephone, and mail surveys to measure the number of trips saltwater anglers take (effort) and the number of fish they catch (catch).

While NOAA Fisheries maintains a central role in developing survey methods and establishing best practices, MRIP Regional Implementation Teams are responsible for selecting survey methods and managing data collection.



Caribbean Regional Implementation Team

Regional Implementation Teams develop Regional Implementation Plans that:

- identify regional recreational fishing catch and effort data needs;
- identify, prioritize, and estimate the cost of additions and improvements to data collection programs.

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2017 RIP Recommendations

1. Develop a Governance Structure

- Establish a regional Steering Committee to guide all subsequent steps.
- Develop a centralized personnel management mechanism.

Design and Implement USVI MRIP

- Develop an effort sampling frame.
- Develop a register of public fishing sites.
- Develop an angler intercept survey design (catch).

3. Refine Puerto Rico MRIP

- Replace the phone survey with a mail survey to obtaining effort information.
- Consider alternative shoreline fishing methods (e.g., kayak, jet ski, snorkel/SCUBA).
- Include ecologically and economically important invertebrate species such as queen conch and spiny lobster.



What's Happened Since the 2017 Regional Implementation Plan was Published

- 2017 hurricane season
- Personnel changes in partner agencies
- Development of Island-based FMPs
 - Resuming collection of recreational catch data is key



Caribbean Regional Implementation Team Reconstituted

- 1st meeting on May 27, 2020
- Introductions and provide regional updates related to recreational fishing
- Review recommendations from the 2017 Plan
- Discuss options for a governance structure
 - Appoint a small working group to develop an options paper
 - Options paper reviewed by Caribbean Team at future meeting
