





WECAFC



- Regional fisheries body
- Acts in advisory capacity for conservation and management of all living marine resources in the Wider Caribbean
- Comprised of 34 Members, including USA

WECAFC Spawning Aggregations Working Group

- Established in 2012
- Joint working group WECAFC, CFMC, OSPESCA, CRFM
- Communications Strategy endorsed in 2019
- Regional Fish Spawning Aggregation Fishery Management Plan – endorsed in 2022
 - Focus on Nassau grouper and mutton snapper
- Active U.S. participation CFMC/NOAA Fisheries





Key Outcomes – SAWG Meeting (14-15 March 2023)





- Hosted by CFMC with support of NOAA Fisheries
- Reviewed implementation of Regional Fish Spawning Aggregation Fishery Management Plan
 - Identified needs increased awareness of plan, knowledge of FSA sites, and protective measures
- Updated on "Big Fish" two-year, trilingual public campaign
 - August 2023 launch with one-hour film release
 - Short films, podcasts, radio kits, PSAs, booklets, posters, digital platform
 - Target fishers, decision makers, general public



Key Outcomes – SAWG Meeting (14-15 March 2023)

- Work Plan updated
- Recommendations developed for WECAFC19:
 - Establishment of a FSA Coordination
 Committee
 - Prioritization of Nassau grouper and mutton snapper for data collection and reporting
 - Use of descending devices as best practice for fish release consistent with U.S. policy





WECAFC Queen Conch Working Group

- Created in 2012
- Joint working group WECAFC, CFMC, OSPESCA, CRFM, CITES



- Regional Queen Conch Fisheries Management and Conservation Plan endorsed in 2016
- Queen Conch Statistical Scientific and Technical Advisory Group established
- Tools to promote CITES implementation, sustainable fisheries management, and improved trade monitoring
- Active U.S. participation CFMC/NOAA Fisheries



Key Outcomes – QCWG Meeting (16 March 2023)



- Reviewed implementation of Regional Queen Conch Fisheries Management and Conservation Plan
- Identified needs:
 - Improved landings data
 - Enhanced understanding of domestic consumption
 - Development of non-detriment findings (CITES)
- Received CITES updates (CoP19 Decisions)
- Pilot project in Jamaica discussed



Key Outcomes – QCWG Meeting (16 March 2023)

- Work Plan updated
- Recommendations developed for WECAFC19:
 - Improve reporting of landings data by processing grades with application of conversion factors
 - Advance development of a genetic toolkit to trace illegal queen conch in trade
 - Improve socio-economic data on local consumption and trade
 - Consider climate change impacts on queen conch resources
