



Women in Fisheries Puerto Rico and the United States Virgin Islands

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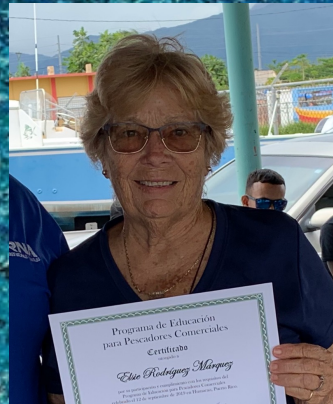
- In Puerto Rico, the workforce is made up of over a 38% of women.
