

Outreach vs education


For education the scientific information must be transformed into teaching materials with adequate pedagogical activities that may be introduced in the regular curricula.

 Targets formal education: teachers, students, classroom and disciplines.



Outreach vs education


- For outreach, the same scientific information must be adapted to different publics.
- Large diversity of strategies.



Outreach vs education

- It takes strategies such as posters, informal texts, banners, exhibits, etc to reach every household with the needed information to understand the management actions.

Individuals engaged in fishing.

Knowledgeable and interested in the conservation and management fisheries to be managed.

Persons who reflect the expertise and interest from the standpoint of geographical distribution, conservation, consumers interests, industry, and the economic and social groups encompassed by the Council's geographical area of concern.

The DAP member is very important for the Council...

He/She becomes the spokesperson before the Council for the groups associated with the local fisheries, and at the same time is an important contact of the Council with these groups.

DAPs and Liaisons Contribution to the Council

From your knowledge and experience in fisheries and management...

DAPs:

Help the scientists and the Council to identify ecological and socioeconomic factors affecting the ecosystem and the fisheries.

Liaisons:

Facilitate communication between fishers, local agencies, NGOs and the Council.
