

## Suggestions for OEAP: common concerns we need to understand together

RESEARCH PRIORITY AMONG EBFM TAP THAT ALIGNS WITH FISHER'S CONCERNS AND THE NEED FOR THE CFMC TO ADDRESS THE TOPIC OF SARGASSUM WITH FISHERS

- Quantify positive and negative effects of Sargassum as critical habitat and effects of inundations on local fisheries.
  - Indices of floating algae already exist, how much ends up on the coastline, and how that affects fisheries, not well established.
  - Coastal effects/predictions of sargassum landings (negative impacts).
  - How it acts as essential fish habitat for pelagic species (benefits)
